

TODAY WE CELEBRATE ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY. Saints' days began as a way to mark the anniversaries of the deaths of Christian martyrs. So All Saints' Day was established as an opportunity to honor all the saints, remembered and forgotten and unknown. The day has been celebrated on or around November 1 since the ninth century. In the Reformed tradition, the emphasis is on the ongoing sanctification of the whole people of God. We especially remember and give thanks for members of the faith community who have died in recent time, and to pray that we will be counted among the company of the faithful in God's eternal realm.
